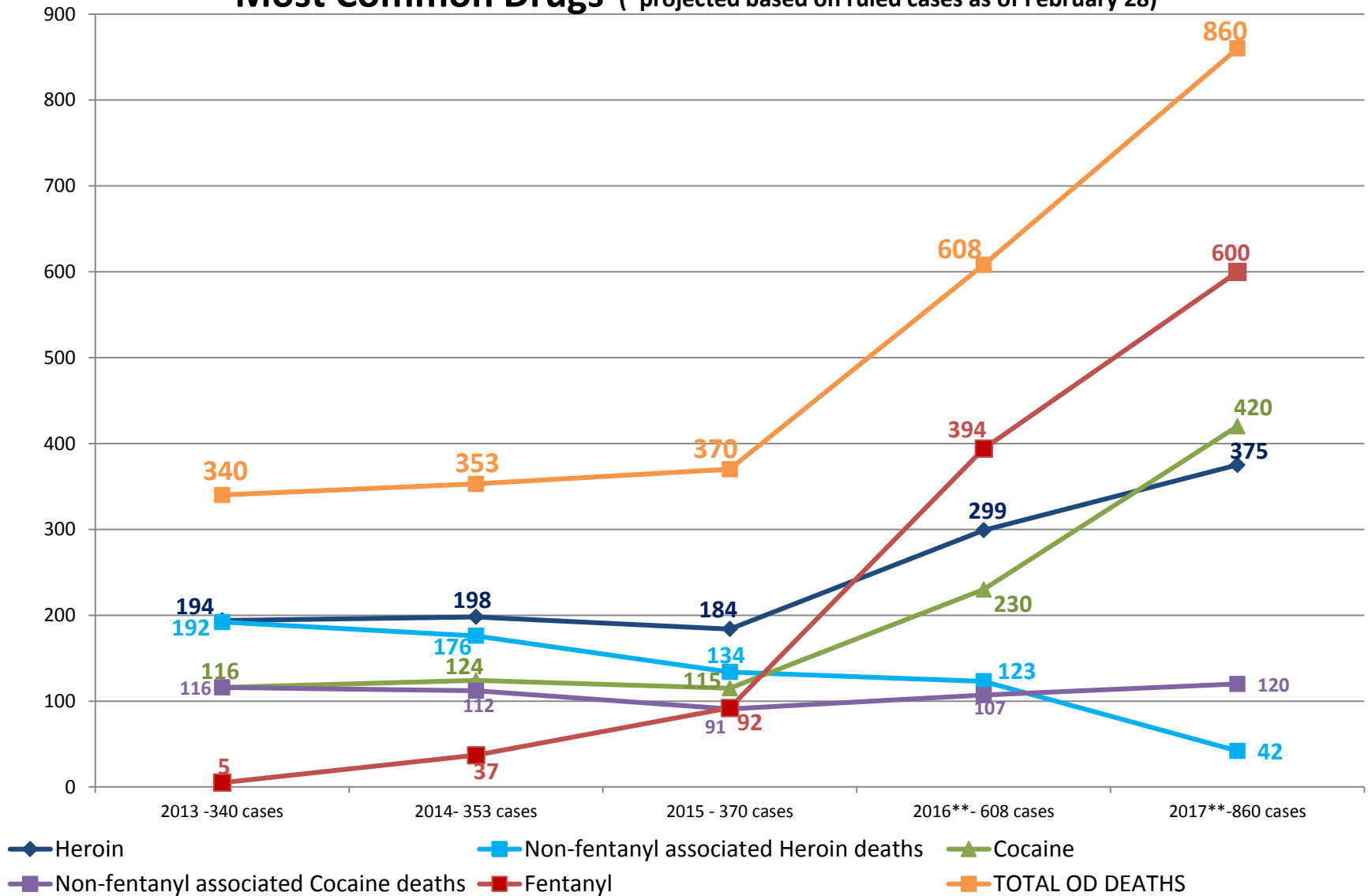

CURRENT PUBLIC HEALTH CRISIS – At least 5 fatalities in March to date

Fatal Cases due to heroin/fentanyl in February—at least 60 (7 cases pending additional testing)

THIS IS THE SINGLE HIGHEST MONTHLY FATALITY RATE (September 2016 – 57 fatalities)

36 - City of Cleveland Residents

VICTIMS

Victims' ages range from 21 – 65

41 Male victims; 19 Female victims

11 African American victims; 1 Asian Indian victim; 48 Caucasian victims (4 hispanic victims)

TRENDS

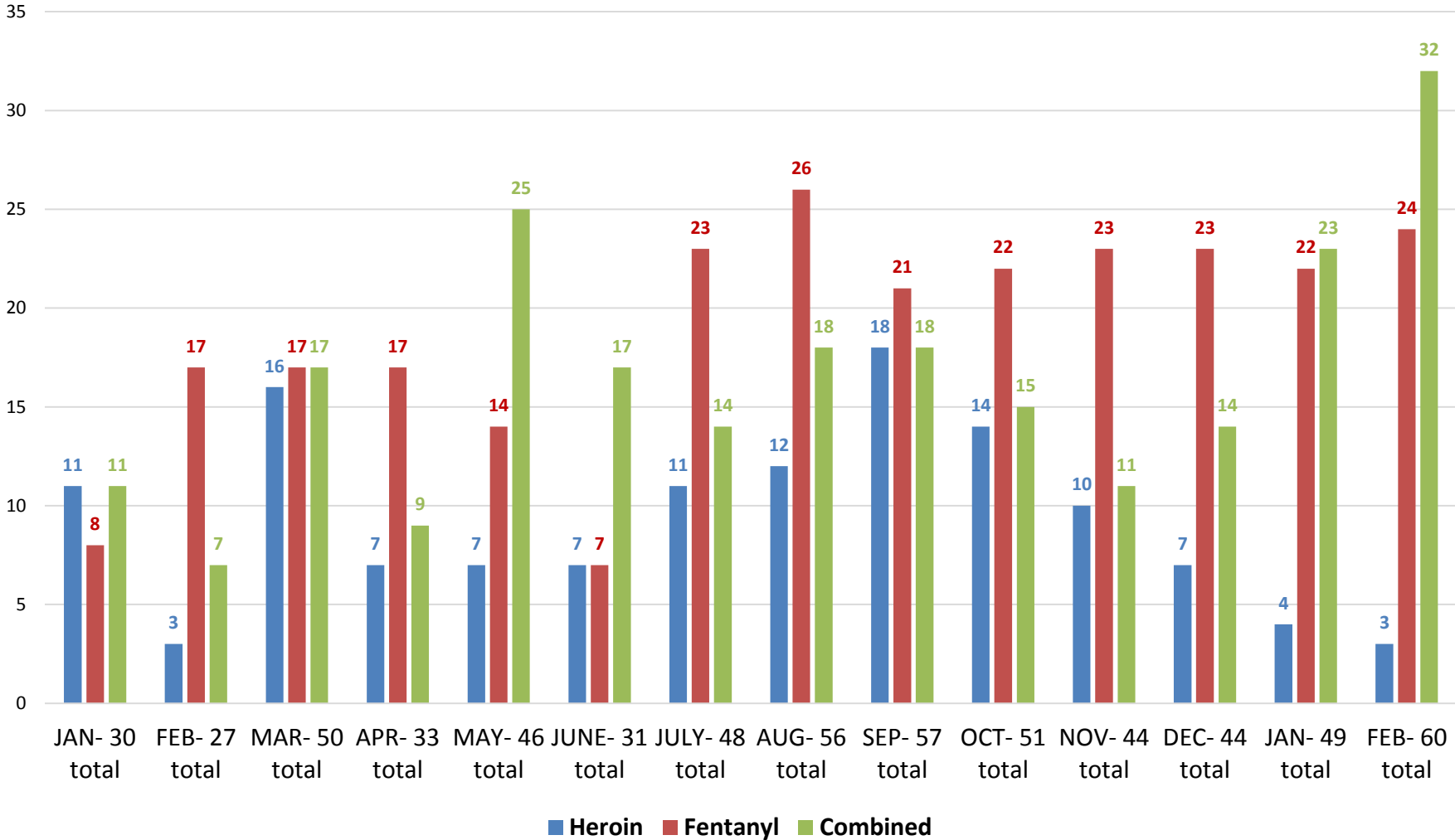
At least **109** victims have died from heroin/fentanyl or in combination in 2017 (January total increased to 49). This compares to 57 in first two months of 2016 and at least **517** in 2016 which was more than double the 228 from 2015. Cocaine deaths are projected to have doubled from 115 to 225 or 230 in 2016.

Carfentanil: 40 CONFIRMED CASES TO DATE in 2016

Rate of African American deaths involving fentanyl is 24% of all victims, nearly double the rate in 2016. February also saw 35 cocaine related deaths (at least 70 for 2017), with 26 being mixed with Fentanyl, Heroin or both (at least 50 for the year).



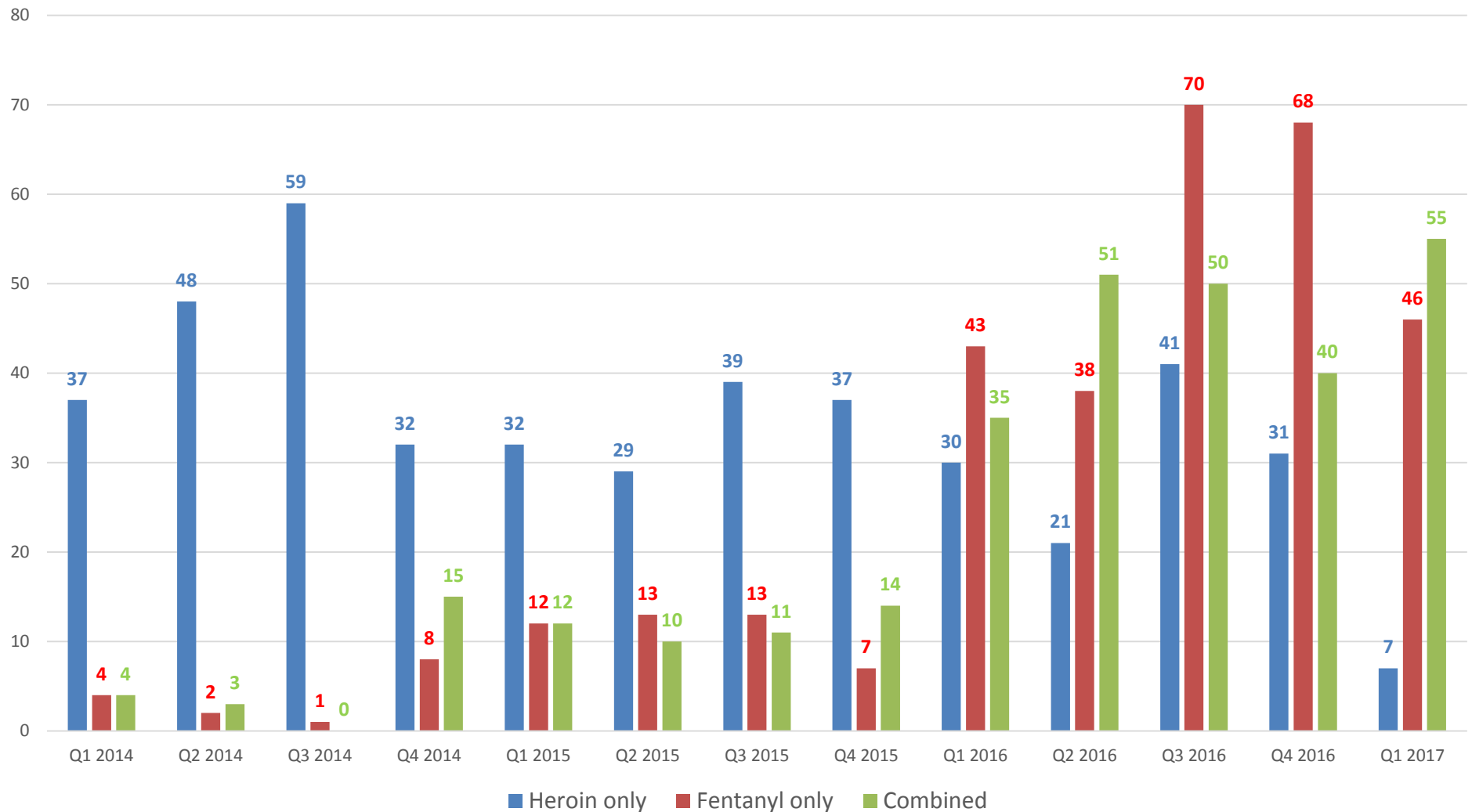
CCMEO 2016-17 Fentanyl & Heroin Related Deaths, by Month

CCMEO Quarterly Heroin/Fentanyl/Combined Deaths 2014-2017* (*2016 -17 ruled cases as of 2-28-17)

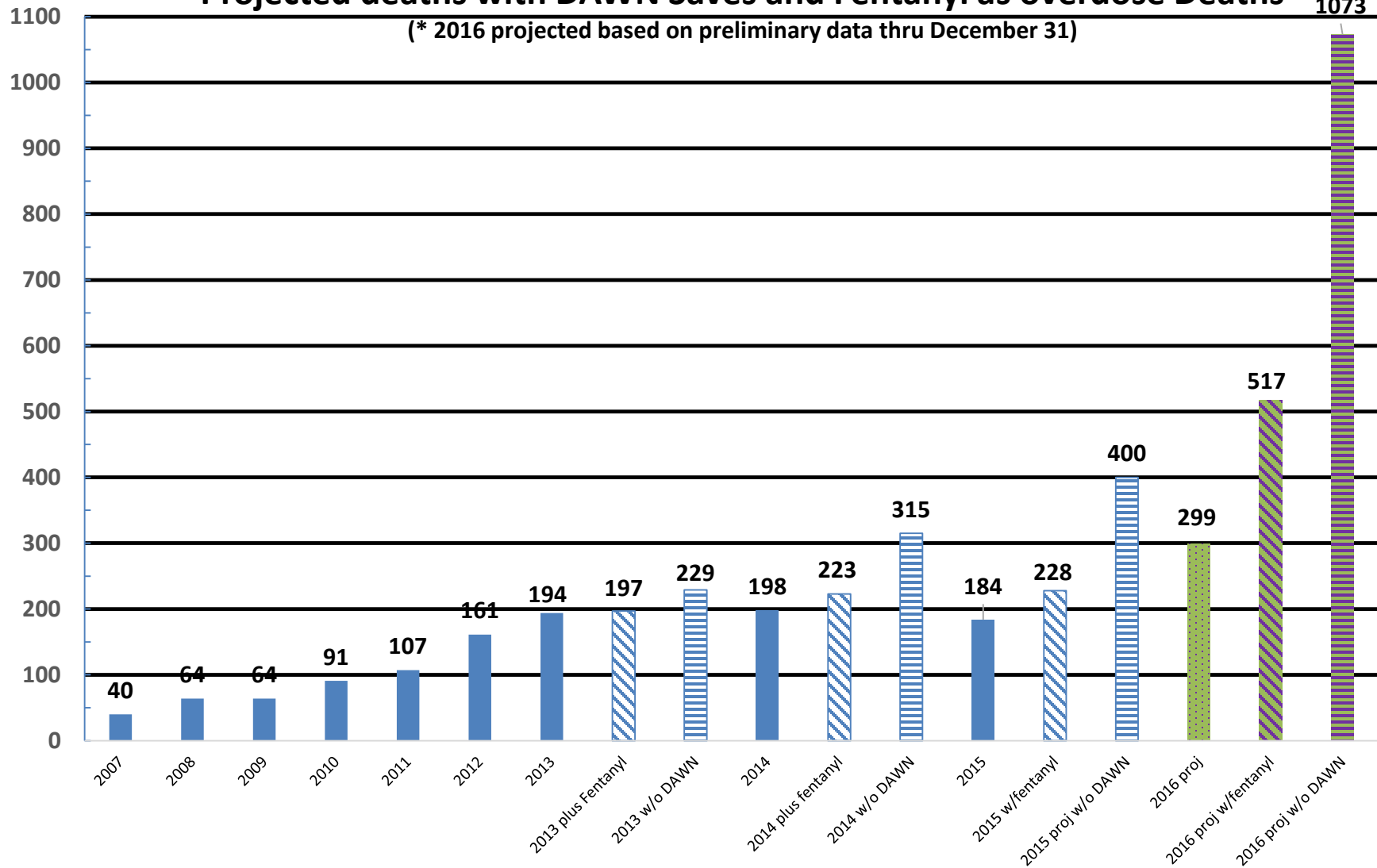

Projected deaths with DAWN Saves and Fentanyl as overdose Deaths

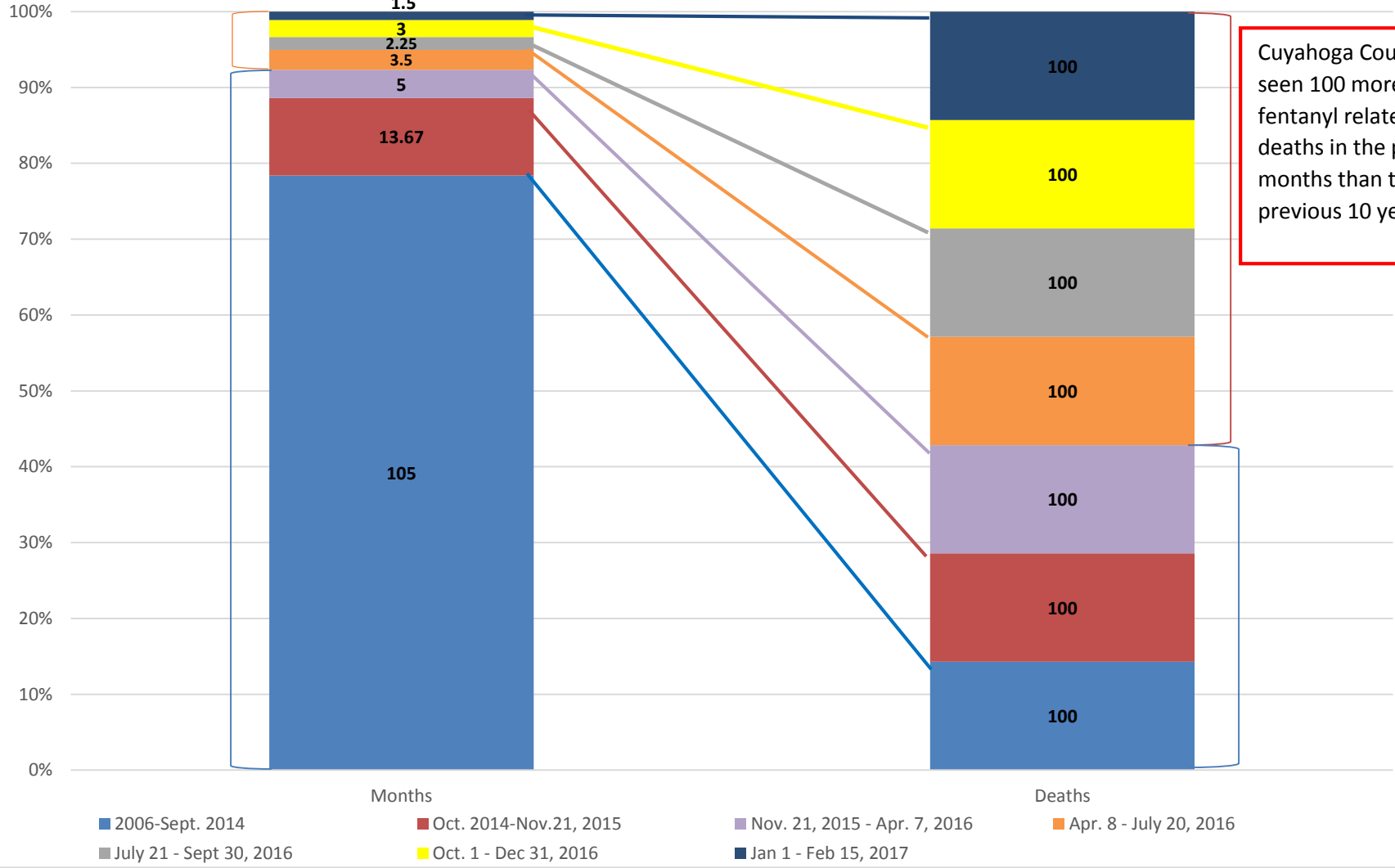

Cuyahoga County Fentanyl Deaths 2006-2017



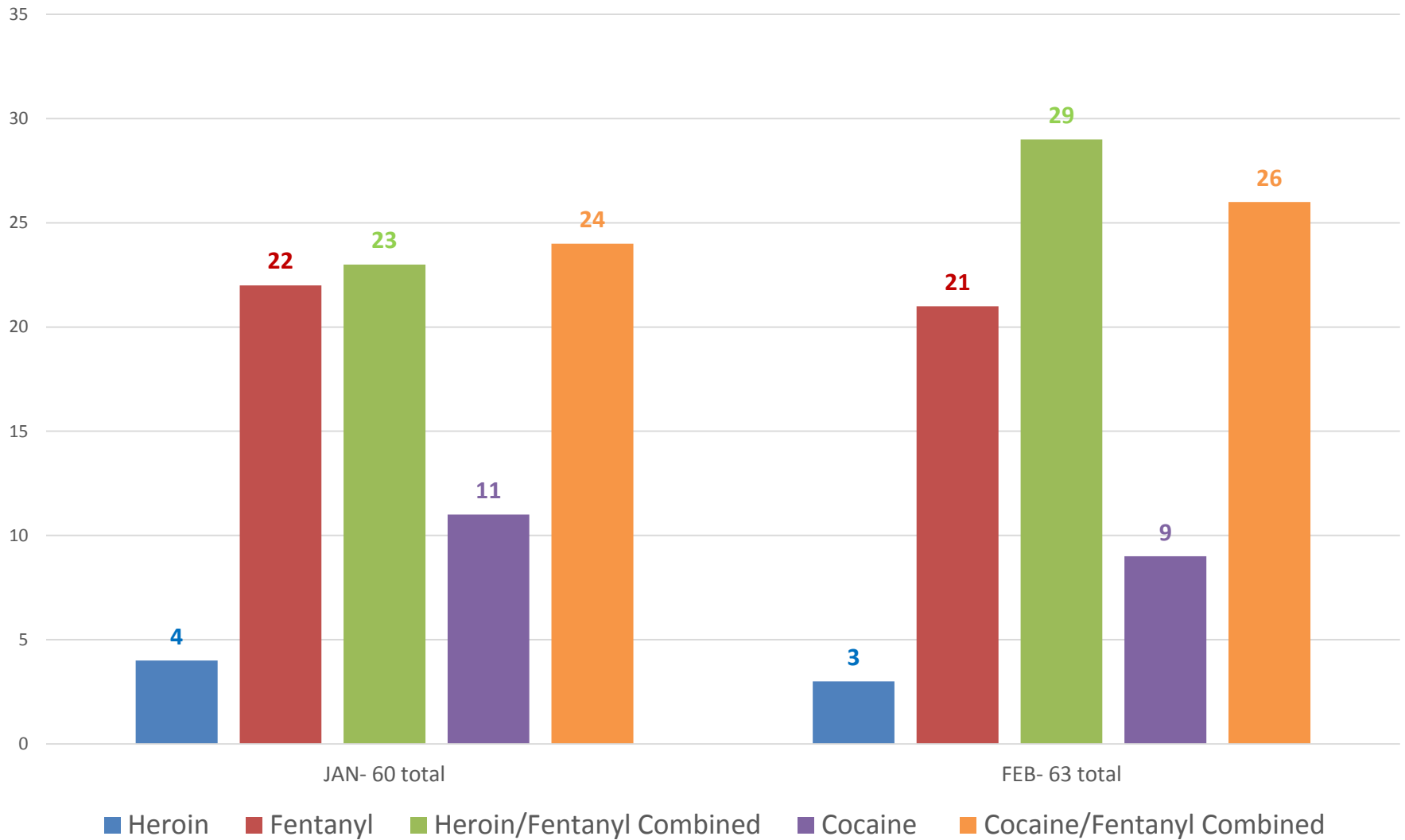
Cuyahoga County has seen 100 more fentanyl related deaths in the past 10 months than the previous 10 years.
