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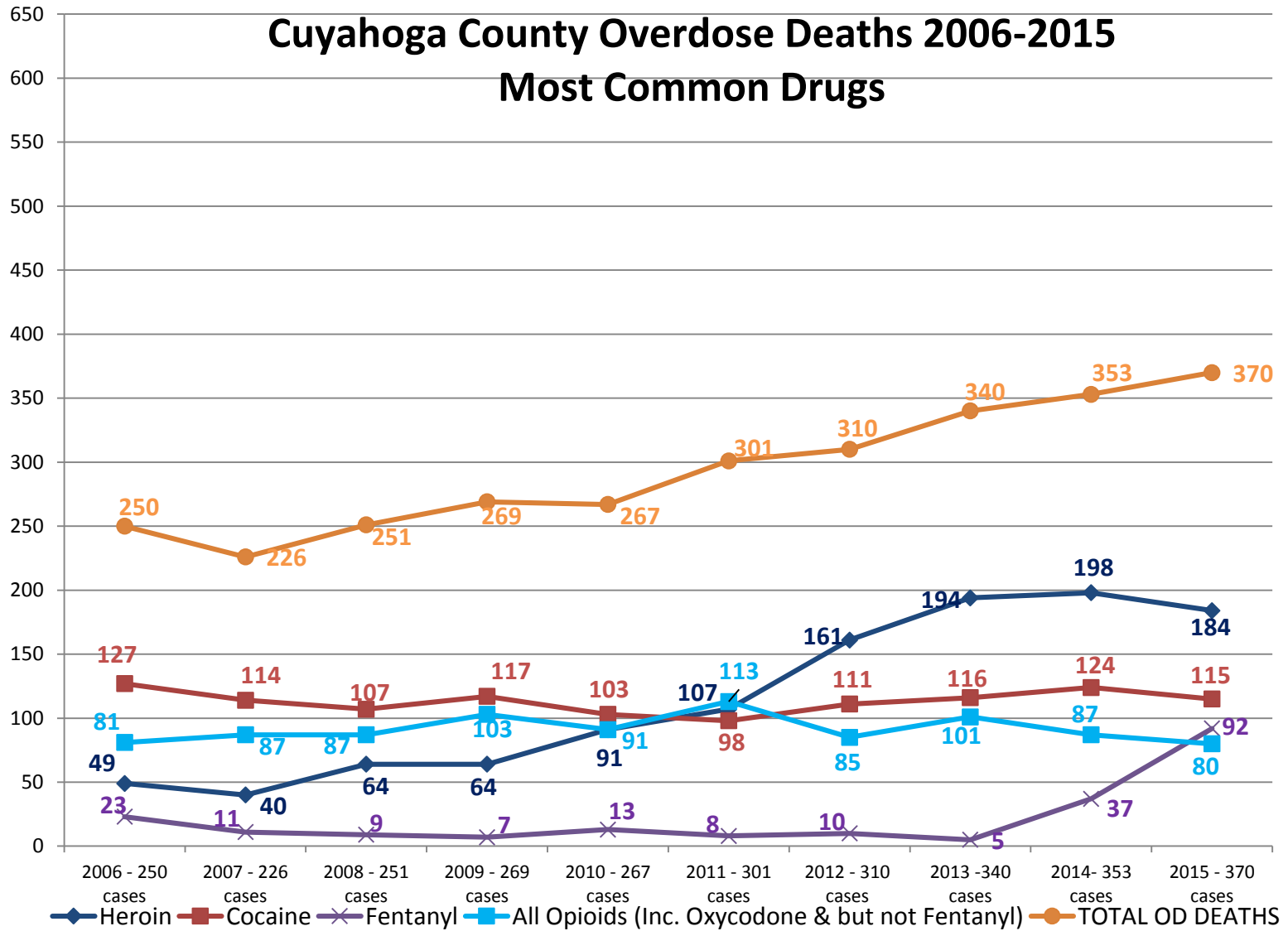

Cuyahoga County Overdose Deaths 2006-2015 Most Common Drugs

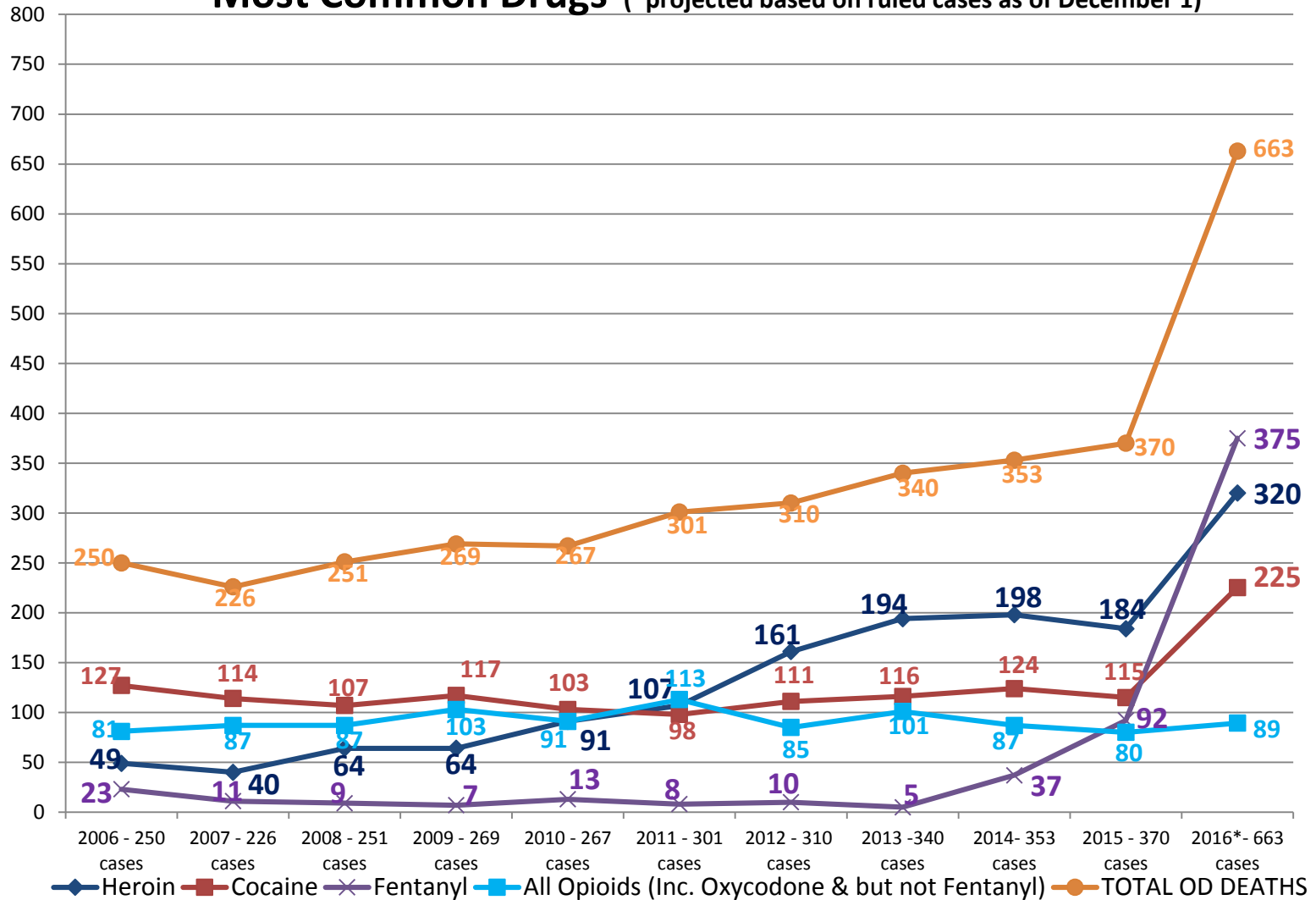

CURRENT PUBLIC HEALTH CRISIS

At least 18 fatalities since December 1

Fatal Cases due to heroin/fentanyl in November—at least **42** (More than two dozen cases are pending further case testing for **carfentanil: 15 CONFIRMED CASES TO DATE**)

20 - City of Cleveland Residents

22 - Suburban Residents- Brooklyn (3), East Cleveland, Euclid (2), Lakewood, Maple Hts., Mayfield, Newburgh Hts., North Royalton, Parma (3), Richmond Hts., Rocky River, Seven Hills, Solon and (4)

VICTIMS

Victims' ages range from 18 – 70

37 Male victims; 5 Female victims

7 African American victims; 35 Caucasian victims (1 hispanic)

EXPONENTIAL RATE OF INCREASE

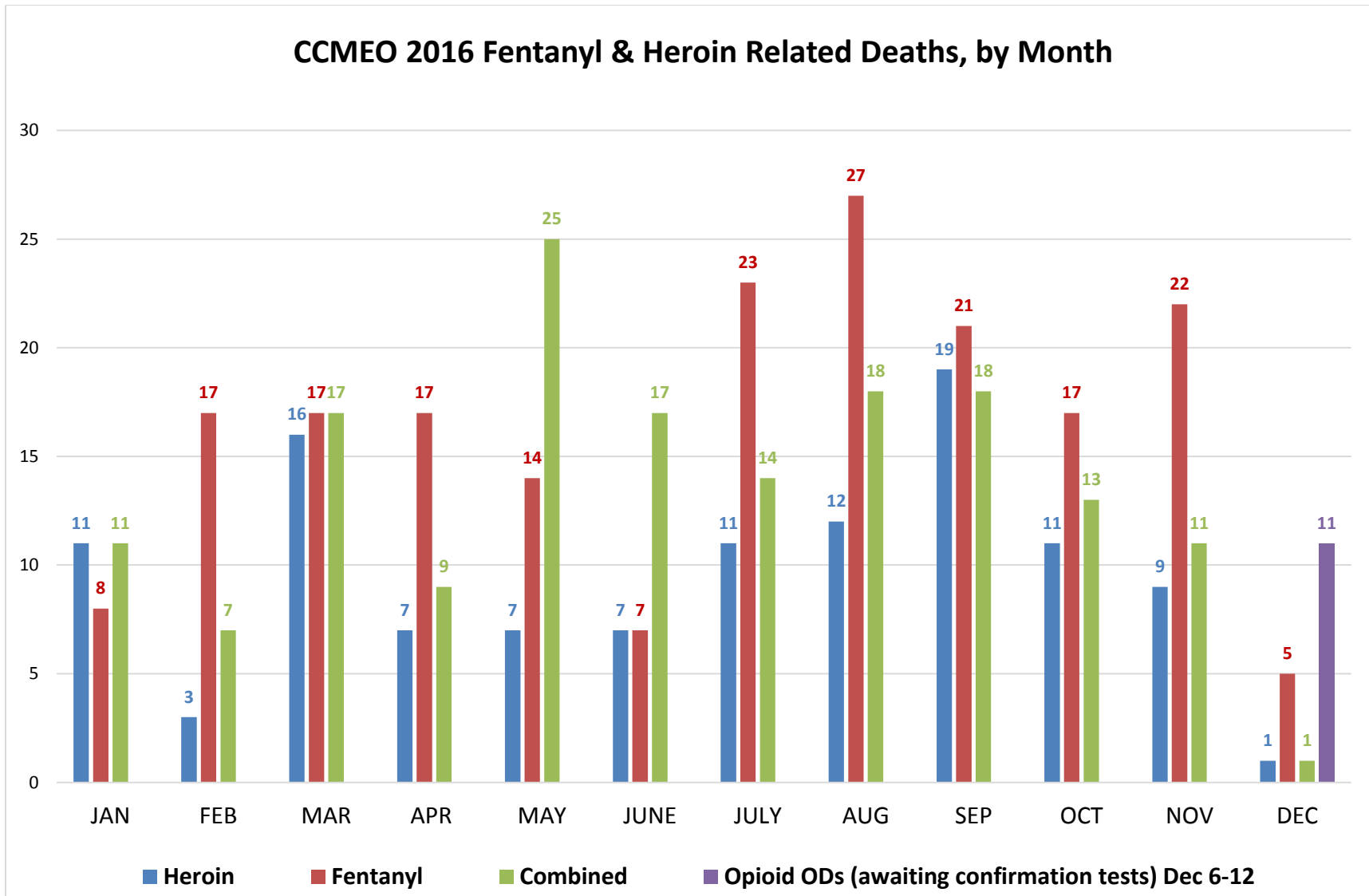
In 2015, one person died every day in Cuyahoga County from a drug overdose.

In 2016, during January and February, one person died every day in Cuyahoga County from a heroin or fentanyl overdose. Since then, we have lost an average of 12 people every week. At least **500** victims have died already in 2016, more than double the 228 from 2015.

CCMEO 2016 Fentanyl & Heroin Related Deaths, by Month

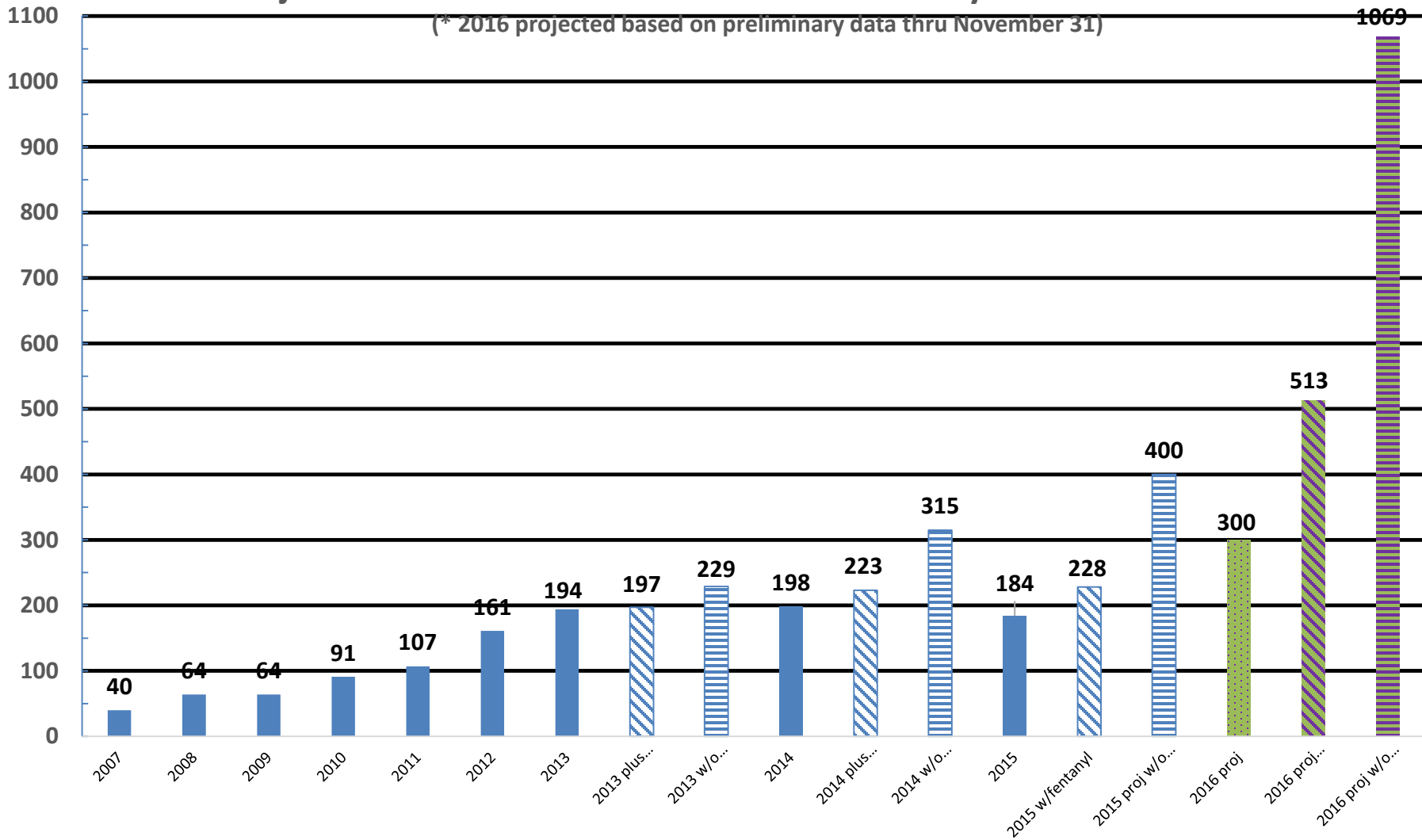

Projected deaths with DAWN Saves and Fentanyl as overdose Deaths

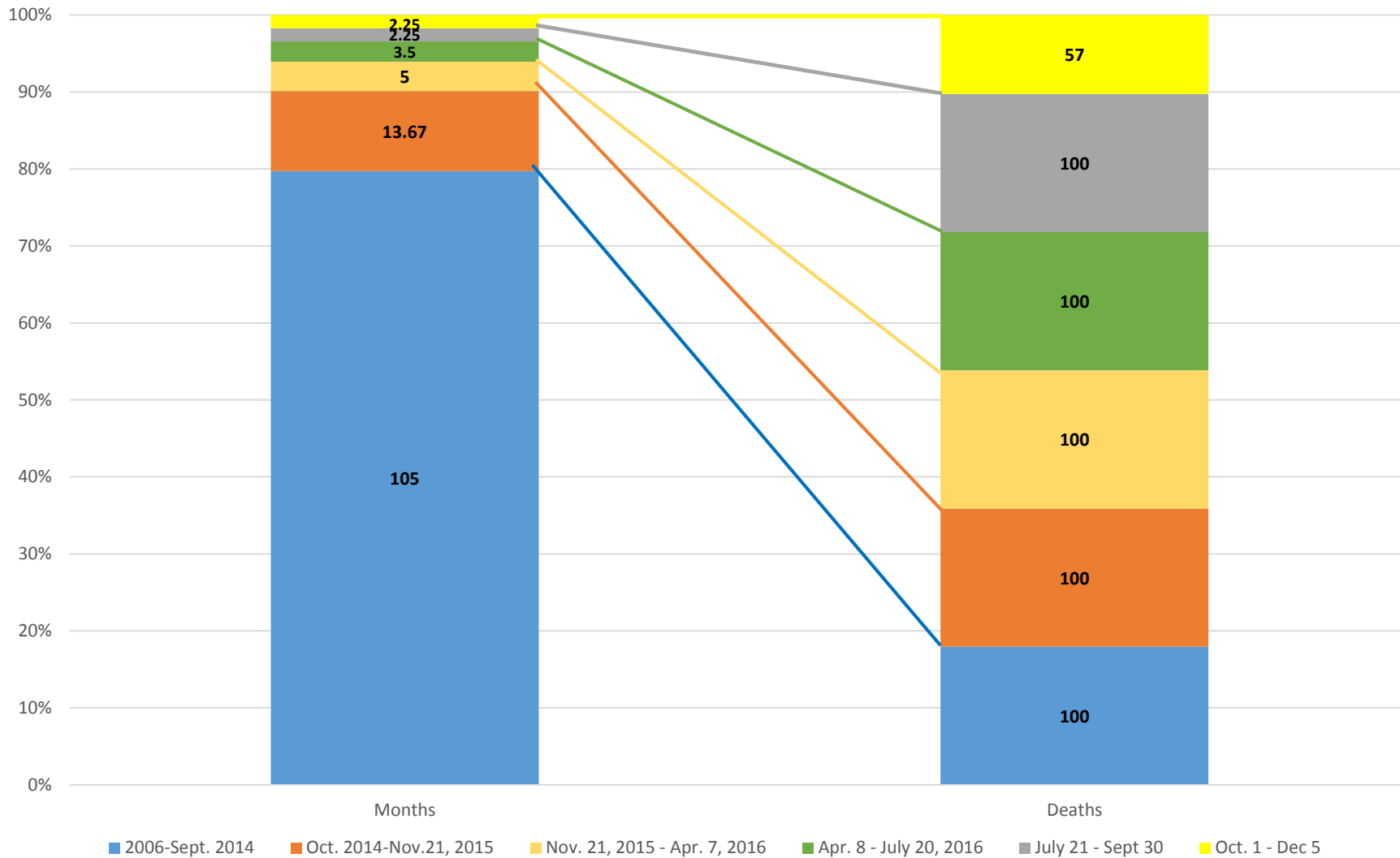
